Reception

In Year R we have started our Spring topic learning all about animals and plants. We have been learning about diurnal and nocturnal animals in our enhanced provision, as well as in Drawing Club through our book 'The rabbit, the dark and the biscuit tin'. During the story the rabbit decides if the dark doesn't come then he won't have to go to bed! We enjoyed going on a journey with the rabbit to explore all of the reasons that plants and nocturnal animals need night time. The children also thought of some very creative actions to learn their new vocabulary words. Ask them to show you them, 'wilting' was one of their favourites!

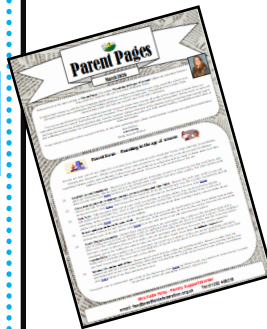
PARENT PAGES
