### Year 1

Our first full week in Year 1 has been very busy and we have shared so much learning already. We have enjoyed reading *The Gruffalo* and then sequencing the pictures from each part of the story. We have also expressed our creative sides by painting our own Gruffalos - it is clear there are some very talented artists in Year 1; everyone looked so closely to include all of the different parts of the Gruffalo's body on their painting. In our Maths lessons, we have been working on our number fluency by counting forwards and backwards from 30 and finding one more than any given number.

### Year 2

Our Year 2 children have had a fantastic start to the year! In our very first full week, they became detectives... on Tuesday morning, we arrived at school to discover large footprints in all three classrooms! The children had to investigate what might have visited. We have explored some great theories from aliens to monsters and they have been busy searching for clues about the creature's feet and colour as well as how it moves, and most importantly... whether it's friendly!? We even created drawings of what we imagine the creature to look like. To help with our investigation, we read the story, *Where the Wild Things Are* and wondered if one of those creatures might have paid us a visit.... In our Maths lessons, we have been sharing our place value knowledge and looking at patterns in the number system. We have practised counting in 10s and rounding 2-digit numbers to the nearest multiple of 10. It has certainly been an exciting start to Year 2!
