Dear Parents,

Happy Friday; further to sharing this month's Action for Happiness' **Optimistic October** calendar last week, I hope you have had a wonderful week, managed to find some sunshine (even if it has had to be metaphorical!) between the showers as well as experienced a few golden moments along the way - as ever, we certainly have at WIS!

This week we began with a truly memorable **Maths Day!** Mrs Fennell led our staff teaching team to deliver a creative and exciting themed day with a problem solving theme; more details overleaf but I wish to thank Mrs Fennell for such a truly inspirational day - the feedback from the children has been overwhelmingly positive and I love hearing them speak so enthusiastically (and confidently!) about Maths.

Although every day at Westfields is busy, Wednesday this week was a particularly full day for us! We began with another **Prospective Parent Session** (attended by 15 families), completed a fire drill with all of the children (who did us all so proud by quickly and safely evacuating the building!) and then following our after school clubs and staff meeting, we held this year's **Parent Reading Workshop!** Once again, Miss Redmond led a very informative session, which was attended by a rather impressive 32 parents. The aim of this session was to provide an overview of how we teach reading, share the progression in reading at WIS, as well as to share resources, top tips, and offer an opportunity for parents to ask any questions. Feedback was once again very positive and we all highly value the opportunities for us to work together - thank you for joining us. Once again, I do appreciate that many parents are unable to join us in the evenings, so please be aware the slides (and handouts provided) have been uploaded to our school website, if you would like to take a look.



In connection with our reading provision, we are pleased to share that we currently have a fantastic group of **volunteer readers** across Key Stage 1.
