A few reminders...

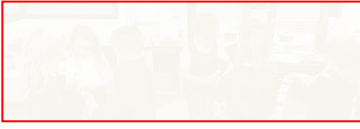

Reception

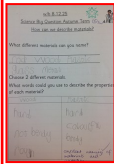
