- *'Clear safeguarding procedures are in place, supported by challenge and oversight by governors, and a pastoral and mental health support structure.'*
- *'Leaders know children and families across the school well, and this supports their academic success.'*
- *'Behaviour across the school is highly positive.'*
- *'Pastoral provision continues to develop well.'*
- *'Strong federation links ensure continuity and progression.'*

The journey we continue to follow as a progressive and responsive school (and federation!) continues to be an exceptionally exciting one and I could not be more proud of our success. Special thanks must be given to the highly professional and dedicated staff team who go above and beyond on a daily basis as well as our fabulous pupils who made sure the inspector knew what we do at Westfields and what are the best bits about their school.

links for some local family fun alongside some quick reference family support helplines and apps... so why not take five minutes to have a read?

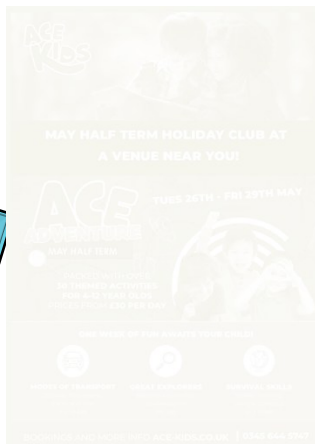


## ACE Kids Provision @ Half Term...
