What have we been learning?

Reception

Year R have been transported through our topic as we have been exploring more about aeroplanes and buses! We have loved making our own paper aeroplanes and tested out how we can make them fly the furthest. The children have been curious about how aircrafts can stay in the air (even though they are so heavy!) and what is needed to make them move at high-speed so high up!

In Maths, the children have been taking a dive into 2D shapes. They have investigated how these can be rotated, change size and be used to create other shapes; we particularly enjoyed seeing how we could make different animals or modes of transport by arranging various shapes in particular ways.

A final highlight has been our Gremlin Dance workshop where we unleashed our inner 'movers and groovers' and immersed ourselves into the joy of dance!

Another week has flown by in Year 1. Even though it has been a shorter week we have still been very busy in our classrooms to get all of our jobs done. We started the week by writing some Paddington preposition sentences. It has been lovely to see the children so engrossed with our new topic of Paddington and London and they were experts in using vocabulary to describe positions. In Maths, we have continued practising our multiples of 5 which the children are really mastering now - well done Year 1s. In our Science lessons we checked in on our bean germination process as well as planted some cress seeds; the pots will be kept in various different environments to see how well they grow. The children made their predictions and are looking forward to seeing the outcome next week...Last but certainly not least, all children have tasted various potential ingredients for their sandwich making. We were very impressed with how adventurous the children have been about tasting different foods.

They look a little still and dull at the moment but we can't wait to see them hatch into butterflies. It has been great to see a life cycle happen in real life and we are now learning about other life cycles in our Science work.
