

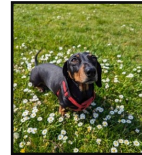
Our School Dog... Dexter's News!

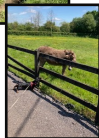
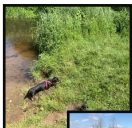
