## Odd Socks Day and The Fynn Dragon Puppet Show

It was great to see the children wearing odd socks in a reminder that we are all unique but equally important. The children spent the day thinking about similarities and differences; taking time to reflect on what they were good at, what they liked and what made them unique. They enjoyed playing games, making posters and completing their "jigsaw piece" for a class puzzle.

Wishworks Puppet Theatre performed the story of Fynn Dragon using a variety of puppetry styles. Fynn had a terrible time on his first day of school; he had trouble making friends because no one would take the time to get to know him. The children were encouraged to interact with the puppets and think about the behaviour choices of some of Fynn's class mates. Although the puppets delivered a serious message, the story was very humorous and had the children in fits of giggles at times.

# What are we learning?

## Year R

Last half term Year R enjoyed learning about different ways to keep healthy. During the week we had fun exercising—each morning we had a 10 minute run and in the afternoon we did some yoga. We choreographed our own dance moves for an 'Under the Sea' dance – we had some great jellyfish, starfish and sharks. We learnt why it was important to clean our teeth and also about which foods were healthy and which are not so good for you. We wrote instructions on how to make a fruit salad and then we made it – it was really yummy!

We were very excited because the eggs we had in our shared area hatched out – we had five lovely chicks to look after. We learnt how they managed to hatch out of the eggs using an egg tooth and watched them grow and their feathers start to form. We were lucky to be able to hold them – they were lovely and soft and sometimes quite noisy!

This term we have two exciting things to look forward to. We are having some building work within our outdoor learning environment and we are going on our first school trip (for some of us it will be the first time on a coach too).



## Year 1

In Year 1 we have enjoyed starting our topic called A Little Brown Bear in London. We have been helping Paddington Bear find his way around London, by writing a tour guide for him to follow. He was also a bit worried as he did not know what he would need to take, so we wrote him a list explaining the things he would need and what he would need them for. In maths we have been looking at the relationship between addition and subtraction and are beginning to recall some facts from memory.

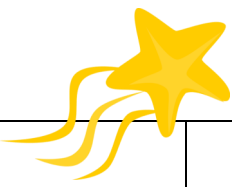


## Year 2

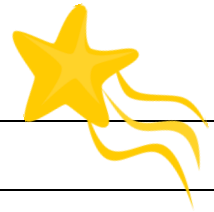
